Shelter-in-Place Plan:

Sheltering-in-place (SIP) is when our household, during an emergency, chooses a room to remain in for safety until professional responders inform us that it is safe to come out or evacuate. Often this is for a chemical or industrial emergency. We also sometimes need to shelter-in-place when we lose utilities in in cold or hot weather.

Evacuation Plan:

Evacuation is when the members of our household leave our home, neighborhood, or city because of an emergency situation. When we are instructed to evacuate, we need to follow instructions from emergency crews and leadership.

The disasters most likely to cause us to need to evacuate are wildfires or house fires, earthquakes, and industrial accidents, but we can be asked to leave for many reasons.
